Measure O Half-Cent Sales Tax Extension to Maintain Funding for Local Services

Wheatland strives to maintain our community character and keep our city a safe, stable, great place to live. As a self-reliant community, locally controlled sales tax revenue has maintained core city services with funding that is controlled by the City and its voters and is not dependent on the State. On the November ballot, Measure O, if approved by City voters, would renew this previously approved funding with no increase in tax rates.

Keeping Wheatland Safe & Prepared

Your health and safety continue to be the City's top priority. If approved, Measure O would renew local funding to maintain City services, including fire and police protection services, emergency response and preparedness, road safety and maintenance, and other city services.

Maintaining Core City Services

The Wheatland City Council placed Measure O on the November 2020 ballot to renew voter-approved, locally controlled funding for City services. If continued by voters, Measure O funding would maintain a reliable source of local funding without raising tax rates.

Measure O will retain current tax dollars that fund the City's own unique local needs and quality of life services. Measure O will maintain current funding levels and prevent cuts to services that help maintain our community character, including:

- Crime prevention and investigation
- Fire protection and emergency response
- Street maintenance and road and pothole repair
- Community-based neighborhood police patrols
- Well-maintained, safe parks

- All funding would be subject to mandatory independent financial audits
