To receive your free compost please bring your own shovel, containers, a tarp and load your own compost.




### On the Road Again

Once you've loaded up the family vehicle with clothes and electronic gadgets, add a bag or stackable bag-lined container to stow bottles, cans, paper, cartons and other recyclables. Teach sustainability to the kids by getting them involved with finding the recycling bin at wayside rests, public parks and even some gas stations.

### I'll Fly Away



Many airports provide recycling bins both inside and outside of secure areas for paper, cans and bottles. Some airlines have in-flight recycling programs for paper, plastic and aluminum, though this can depend on recycling programs at the destination airport. Ask your flight attendant if they are recycling - if not, carry your bottle, can or magazine off the plane and find the nearest recycling bin.



### Eco-stays

Once you are at your hotel, ask the clerk at check-in about the best way to recycle items from your room. If you can't recycle at your hotel, seek out the nearest public recycling bin. Better yet, do a little research before you choose hotels and restaurants. Web sites such as [www.istaygreen.org](http://www.istaygreen.org) rate hotels' eco-friendliness based on a comprehensive 70-point survey.



### Choose to Reuse

Whether flying or driving, bring along reusable water bottles, coffee mugs and shopping totes to reduce waste.

## Free Tire Disposal

Beginning July 1st, the Regional Waste Management Authority has a new allotment of coupons available for the FREE disposal of up to 20 residentially-generated auto or truck tires – even if you participated in the program that ended June 30th. Residents of Yuba or Sutter County can receive a coupon by calling (530) 634-6890 between 9:00 am and 12:00 noon or 1:00 pm and 4:00 pm each weekday. Please indicate the number of tires you have when you call. This program is for residential use only-NO BUSINESSES.

Coupons will be distributed while supplies last on a first come, first served basis. Coupons expire one month from the date of issuance. The program is limited to tires filling up to 17 inch diameter rims. Tires do not need to be removed from the rims. If hauling more than 9 tires at one time, the Local Enforcement Agency Conditions on the reverse side of the coupon must be completed.

Proper maintenance of your vehicle's tires is the key to driving more miles before purchasing new tires. Proper maintenance is also the key to reducing the number of tires being thrown away.

According to the experts, preventing uneven wear is the key to increasing the life of your tires. The Rubber Manufacturers Association recommends regularly rotating your tires and checking wheel alignment following the schedules specified in the vehicle owner's manual. Owners should get into the habit of checking tire pressure at least once a month when tires are cool and before every long trip and inspecting tires frequently for uneven wear and tread wear. Many tire service centers offer these visual inspections free of charge.

Following the manufacturers vehicle loading recommendations, including baggage carried on top, is also important to prevent uneven wear. Don't forget that towed trailers transfer some of their weight to the towing vehicle.

Not only is proper tire care a safe and economical practice, it is also good for the environment. Storage of tires on private and public property can pose a danger to public health and safety. Stored tires are potentially combustible and can become a breeding ground for rodents, mosquitoes and other insects. Grant funding provided by the

California Department of Resources Recycling and Recovery CalRecycle (CalRecycle). All tires disposed of at Recology Yuba-Sutter facilities are sent to a recycling facility, not to the landfill!
